Metrolink services set to return to MediaCityUK

Metrolink services from Deansgate-Castlefield to MediaCityUK are expected to return on Monday 1 August, subject to testing and commissioning of newly laid rails being completed successfully over the weekend.

Tram services have been suspended along the whole of the Eccles Metrolink line and replaced with buses since 26 June, when the essential rail replacement work began.

The Metrolink operator, MRDL, is <u>renewing sections of Eccles line rail</u>, which is now 16 years old.

Passengers are advised to check the Metrolink website – www.metrolink.co.uk – and @MCRMetrolink Twitter feed before travelling for the latest service updates.

Further finishing works will be required around the tracks but are not expected to impact on services. The next phase of work, to upgrade sections of track between MediaCityUK and Eccles, is due for completion at the end of August, when the full line will re-open.

At the same time, <u>no trams are running through St Peter's Square</u> as the final works to build a new, much larger stop take place.

<u>A new video shows progress on the bigger, better St Peter's Square stop</u> – the first on the tram network to have trees planted on the platform – which will also reopen to the public at the end of August.

Work is being carried out simultaneously and over the quieter summer period to limit the impact on customers.



Replacement bus services and signed walking routes continue to offer good access to the city and key destinations along the Eccles line.

There will also be some changes to replacement bus services from 1 August and more information is available now at www.transformationinformation.com/summer-changes.

The following replacement bus services will run approximately every 10 minutes from Monday 1 August to end of August:

X1: Piccadilly Station (Fairfield St) – Cornbrook (Chester Rd) – Trafford Bar – Cornbrook – Piccadilly Station (Fairfield St)

• Monday to Friday. Between 7am – 9.30am and 3.30pm – 8pm.

X2: Piccadilly Station (Fairfield St) – Deansgate-Castlefield – Cornbrook (Chester Road)

– Trafford Bar (towards Eccles only) – Exchange Quay – Salford Quays – MediaCityUK –

Harbour City – Broadway – Langworthy – Weaste – Ladywell – Eccles (circular)

Notes to Editors

- 1. Transport for Greater Manchester (TfGM) is the transport delivery arm for Greater Manchester Combined Authority (GMCA) and its Transport for Greater Manchester Committee (TfGMC).
- 2. TfGM oversees transport and travel across Greater Manchester, home of the UK's largest regional economy outside London and a diverse population of over 2.7 million people.

3. TfGM:
